Registration —September -

Girl Scouts of the United States of America (GSUSA), commonly referred to as simply Girl Scouts, is a youth organization for girls in the United States and American girls living abroad. Founded by Juliette Gordon Low in 1912, it was organized after Low met Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of Scouting, in 1911. She was extremely impressed with the program and decided to start an organization for girls.

First Nazareth has five troops: Daisies, Brownies, Juniors, Cadettes and Seniors/Ambassadors. Registration started in September 2023. Registration fee is \$30.00.

Silver Award



First Nazareth Girl Scouts are proud to report that three young ladies have met the extensive requirements needed to earn the highest award for Cadette scouts. The Silver Award is the second highest award for girl scouts overall—second only to the Gold Award.

The Silver Award was first introduced to girls in 1980 at the National Program Conferences, launching alongside the updated Gold Award. Requirements for the Silver Award, the Gold Award, and the new Cadette and Senior badges were first found in the book "You Make the Difference: Handbook for Cadette and Senior Girl Scouts," published in June 1980.

Prerequisites for the Silver Award

In order to earn the Award, a girl must be in 6th, 7th or 8th grade (or equivalent); be a registered Girl Scout Cadette; and must complete a Cadette Journey before she can begin her work on a Silver Award project.


